HRVATSKA SUVREMENA MEDALJA

Od medalje do transmedalje

U osvitu secesije, rađa se razdoblje autohtone hrvatske moderne medaljerske umjetnosti. Njeni su začetnici hrvatski kipari Robert Frangeš-Mihanović (1872. – 1940.) i Rudolf Valdec (1872. – 1929.), čije spomenice dosežu razinu onodobnog europskog medaljerstva. Bogat medaljerski opus Ive Kerdića (1881. – 1953.) ujedno je i okosnica povijesti hrvatskoga medaljerstva tijekom prve polovice 20. stoljeća.

To razdoblje obilježeno je secesijskom dekorativnošću i plitkim, gotovo slikarskim reljefom, a od 20-ih godina prošlog stoljeća i pročišćenim volumenima art-decoa.

Promjenom oblika povjesne medalje 1940-ih, Vanja Radauš (1906. – 1975.) preoblikuje zadani krug medalje u formalnom i morfološkom smislu i na taj način utire put suvremenom hrvatskom medaljerstvu.

Želimir Janeš (1916. – 1996.) ide dalje, te s morfološkog aspekta uvodi forme taktila i stajačica. Kosta Angeli Radovani (1916. – 2002.) ostavlja samo izražajno napeto lice kao formu i jedini sadržaj medalje.

Raznovrsnošću i brojnošću minuciozno izvedenih radova, u današnjem trenutku ističe se medaljerstvo Damira Mataušića, s utvrđenim samosvojnim rječnikom simbola i uvođenjem novih tehnika i materijala, prihvataljivim suvremenoj reprezentativnoj medalji.

Već na značajnoj izložbi *Suvremena medalja u Hrvatskoj*, održanoj 1969. godine,¹ zapažena su preoblikovana medaljerska djela u odnosu na tradicionalnu medalju, no uglavnom po svom oblikovnom svojstvu. Istovremeno, zadržano je njeno izvorno poimanje kao počasnice važnoj osobi ili društvenom događaju.

Memorijali Ive Kerdića, od 1980. godine do danas,² odražavaju postignuća suvremenog hrvatskog medaljerstva. Unatoč dvojbama koje se u trogodišnjim intervalima postavljaju, hrvatsko suvremeno medaljerstvo vrlo je vitalno po svojim individualnim vrijednostima i oblicima izražavanja. Za kontinuitet i revitalizaciju hrvatskog medaljerstva značajno je osnivanje usmjerenja Mala plastika i medaljerstvo na Kiparskom odsjeku Akademije likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu 1996. godine. Pod vodstvom prof. Damira Mataušića stasali su brojni mladi kipari posvećeni medaljerstvu i maloj plastici, kiparskim disciplinama između kojih se danas sve više brišu granice. Zahvaljujući bliskoj suradnji Hrvatskog novčarskog zavoda i Hrvatske narodne banke (i samo ponekih ostalih hrvatskih institucija) s hrvatskim medaljerima, egzistira i oficijelna, reprezentativna hrvatska medalja, rađena istim rukama kojima u

intimnom okruženju oblikuju vlastite kreativne medaljerske svjetove.

Uobičajeno shvaćanje medalje u kulturno-povijesnom kontekstu je njeno lice i naličje, sadržaj i smisao. Kao takva opstaje i danas, ali postaje i nešto potpuno novo i drugačije. Njeno je osuvremenjeno lice *samopotica*³ i rezultat je čistog umjetničkog promišljanja i djelovanja.

Suvremena umjetnička medalja samo je još po formi i formatu medalja. Postaje *transmedalja* jer iskoračuje iz svog medijskog determinizma i udaljava se od stilskih obrazaca. Ona je stajačica, taktil, objekt i mala skulptura. Nacrtana je i ocrtana, obojana je i oslikana.⁴ Često je izrađena od raznovrsnih i novih, nekonvencionalnih, skulptorskih materijala. Ako je pak i izlivena u bronci, lišena je društvenih tema i dokumentarnosti događaja. Sadrži vrlo osobne teme, promišljanja i osjećaje. Njen kontekst je asocijativan i meditativan. Suvremena hrvatska medaljerska umjetnost u suglasju je s globalnim kretanjima u vizualnim umjetnostima. Apsorbira najnovije umjetničke trendove i umjetnicima omogućuje iskazivanje vlastitog doživljavanja svijeta i stavova prema suvremenim i univerzalnim ljudskim temama preko najrazličitijih oblikovnih sredstava i materijala.⁵

Nakon skoro tri desetljeća izložbe suvremenih medaljera u Zagrebu,⁶ Moderna galerija prezentira recentna ostvarenja hrvatskih medaljera.

Na izložbi *Hrvatska suvremena medalja* sudjeluje 26 hrvatskih medaljera svih naraštaja s 67 djela nastalih od 1990. godine do danas. To su: Ivan Antolić, Paula Banić, Kruno Bošnjak, Zdravko Brkić, Ana Divković, Stjepan Divković, Rebecca Glavan Glušac, Karlo Gross, Marko Horvat, Kuzma Kovačić, Đurđica Kovačićek, Maja Krstić-Lukač, Margareta Landau Nejašmić, Damir Mataušić, Jelena Mavrić, Matko Mijić, Medarda Pack, Matej Pašalić, Luka

Petrinjak, Anja Planinčić, Irena Podvorac, Judita Poljak, Stipe Sikirica, Maja Šimunović, Martina Vrbljanin, Željko Zima. Izložba omogućava uvid u raznovrstan i dinamičan svijet raznoliko koncipiranih i oblikovanih djela suvremenog hrvatskog medaljerstva visokog likovnog dosega.

THE CROATIAN CONTEMPORARY MEDAL

From Medal to Transmedal

The dawn of the Viennese Secession saw the birth of an indigenous Croatian art of the modern medal. Its begetters were the Croatian sculptors Robert Frangeš-Mihanović (1872 – 1940) and Rudolf Valdec (1872 – 1929), whose commemoratives were fully up to the level of the European medallists of the time. The rich medal-making oeuvre of Ivo Kerdić (1881 – 1953) constituted the central core of the history of Croatian medal-making during the first half of the 20th century. This period was marked by Secession or Art Nouveau decorativeness, with shallow, practically painterly relief. From the 1920^s the medal in Croatia took on the refined volumes of Art Deco. With a change in the historical shape of the medal, in the 1940^s Vanja Radauš (1906 – 1975) reshaped the well-entrenched circular form, in both a formal and a morphological sense, and in this way blazed the trail for contemporary Croatian medals. Želimir Janeš (1916 – 1996) went a step further and morphologically speaking brought in the forms of the tactile object and the free standing object. Kosta Angeli Radovani (1916 – 2002) left the expressively tense face as the form and only content of the medal. In today's age, the medal-making oeuvre of Damir Mataušić stands out for the diversity and

volume of the minutely produced works, with a well established independent vocabulary of symbols and the introduction of new techniques and materials, acceptable to the contemporary representative medal.

By the time of the important exhibition *The Contemporary Medal in Croatia*, held in 1969¹, medals that had been transformed with respect to the tradition of the genre were observed, but on the whole for their formal properties. At the same time, the original conception as way of honouring an important person or social event was retained. Since 1980, the *Ivo Kerdić Memorials*², have reflected the achievements of contemporary Croatian medal-making. Notwithstanding the doubts that are raised in the three-year intervals, Croatian contemporary medal-making is very vital in its individual values and forms of expression. The founding of the small scale sculpting and medal-making major at the Academy of Fine Arts in 1996 was significant for the continuity and revitalisation of the medal making tradition in Croatia. Taught by Damir Mataušić, numerous young sculptors dedicated to medal making and small scale sculpture, sculptural disciplines the boundaries between which

were more or less erased, grew to maturity. Thanks to the close collaboration of the Croatian Monetary Institute and the Croatian National Bank (and just a few other Croatian institutions) with Croatian medallists, there is an official, representative Croatian medal, made with the same hands with which in their intimate surroundings they give shape to their own creative medallist worlds.

The common understanding of the medal in the cultural history context is its obverse and reverse, content and sense. It exists in the same shape today, but is also becoming something entirely new and different.

Its updated face is self-starting³ and the result of pure artistic thinking and acting.

The contemporary art medal is only in its form and format a medal. It is becoming the *transmedal*, for it has stepped out of the determinism of its medium and put a distance between itself and stylistic templates. It is a free-standing and a tactile object, an object and a small scale sculpture. It is drawn and contoured, coloured and painted⁴. It is often made of several heterogeneous and new and unconventional sculptural materials. But if it is case in bronze, it is devoid of social themes and the documentariness of the event. It has very personal themes, reflections and feelings. Its context will be associative and meditative.

The contemporary Croatian art of the medal is consistent with global movements in the visual arts. It has absorbed the most recent trends and enables artists to express their own perception of the world and their views on contemporary and universal human themes via extremely diverse formal resources and materials⁵.

After almost three decades of the exhibition of contemporary medallists in Zagreb⁶, the Modern Gallery is now presenting the most recent creations of Croatian medallists.

Twenty six Croatian medallists are taking part in the exhibition *The Croatian Contemporary Medal*, of all generations, with 67 works created since 1990. These artists are : Ivan

Antolčić, Paula Banić, Krunic Bošnjak, Zdravko Brkić, Ana Divković, Stjepan Divković, Rebecca Glavan Glušac, Karlo Gross, Marko Horvat, Kuzma Kovačić, Đurđica Kovačiček, Maja Krstić-Lukač, Margareta Landau Nejašmić, Damir Mataušić, Jelena Mavrić, Matko Mijić, Medarda Pack, Matej Pašalić, Luka Petrinjak, Anja Planinčić, Irena Podvorac, Judita Poljak, Stipe Sikirica, Maja Šimunović, Martina Vrbiljanin, Željko Zima. The exhibition provides an insight into the diverse and dynamic world of works of Croatian medal making conceived and shaped very diversely, all of them of outstanding in their visual scope.

Ivan Antolčić

Zagreb, Štefanićeva 5

Roden je 1928. godine u Komarevu. Završio je Školu primijenjene umjetnosti u Zagrebu 1953. Od 1954. do 1955. radio je u HNK-u kao scenski kipar i scenograf. Bavi se ilustracijom i opremanjem knjiga te grafičkim dizajnom kazališnih plakata od kojih se na stotinu nalaze u zbirci Instituta za teatrologiju HAZU. U nakladi *Straža* objavio je grafičke mape (*Korablja I.* i *Korablja II.*). Autor je svečanog zastora za Zagrebačko kazalište lutaka 2006. Dobitnik je niza priznanja, nagrada i odlikovanja, među kojima je i Nagrada za životno djelo ULUPUH-a 2010. Radi reljefe, medalje i plakete slobodnih oblika i simboličkih sadržaja poetičnog nadahnuća i dječje zaigranosti.

Born in 1928, in Komarevo. Completed the School of Applied Art in Zagreb in 1953. From 1954 to 1955 he worked in the CNT as stage sculptor and set-designer. He is also engaged in illustration and book design as well as design for theatre posters, a hundred or so of which are found in the collection of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts Institute for Theatre Studies. In the *Straža* imprint he published some graphic portfolios (*Korablja I.*, and *Korablja II.*). He is the creator of the front curtain for the Zagreb Puppet Theatre of 2006. He has won a series of commendations, prizes and decorations, among which is the ULUPUH Lifetime Achievement Award, 2010. He does reliefs, medal, plaquettes, free forms and symbolic contents, poetically inspired and childishly playful.

Paula Banić

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Rođena je 1987. u Zagrebu. Magistrirala je 2014. na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu, Odjelu kiparstva – usmjerenje Mala plastika i medaljerstvo u klasi prof. Damira Mataušića. U ciklusu *Znakovi vremena* umjetnica aplicira otisak dijela lica svojih profesora s Akademije na medalje u kojima želi „uhvatiti“ njihovu osobnost, neponovljivost i karakter.

Born in 1987 in Zagreb; she took a master's in 2015 at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb, sculpture department, small scale sculpture and medal making major in the class of Damir Mataušić. In the series *Signs of the Time*, the artist has applied an impression of parts of the faces of her teachers from the Academy onto the medal, wanting to catch something of their personality, uniqueness and character.

Kruno Bošnjak

Zagreb, Đordićeva 1A

Rođen je u Lovreću kraj Imotskoga 1936. Akademiju likovnih umjetnosti završio u Zagrebu 1964., na kojoj je bio profesor od 1985. do 2006. U oblikovanju portreta, figuralnih kompozicija sakralne tematike, aktova i spomeničke plastike oslanja se na tradicionalna realistička rješenja, a djela male plastike i medaljerstva karakterizira svježina i neposrednost modeliranja. Kao medaljer izradio je više hrvatskih odličja.

Born in Lovreć, near Imotski, in 1946. He graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb in 1964, and taught at this institution from 1985 to 2006. In the shaping of portraits, figural compositions of religious subjects, nudes and monumental sculpture he draws on traditional realistic approaches and his works of small scale sculpture and medal making are characterised by freshness and immediacy of modelling. As medallist he has produced a number of Croatian decorations.

Zdravko Brkić

Zagreb, Slavenskog 27

Rođen je 1949. u Zagrebu. Diplomirao je kiparstvo na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu 1972. Izlaže od 1978., redovito na Memorijalnom trijenalu Ive Kerdića i na FIDEM-ovim izložbama. Posvetio je cijeli svoj umjetnički rad medaljerstvu s osobno oblikovanim spomenicama na značajne događaje i ličnosti, vješto objedinjenih pojedinih dijelova. Sažima karakteristike portretiranih i ono što ih obilježava na razvidan i plastičan način.

Born in 1949 in Zagreb, and graduated in sculpture at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb in 1972. Has exhibited since 1978, regularly so at the Ivo Kerdić Memorial Triennial and at FIDEM shows. He has devoted the whole of his artistic work to medal-making, with personally shaped commemoratives of important events and personalities, with skilfully united individual parts. He sums up the characteristics of the subjects of the portraits and what marks them in a clear and three-dimensional manner.

Ana Divković

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Rođena je u Zagrebu 1986. Diplomirala je 2010. na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu, Odjelu kiparstva – usmjerenje Mala plastika i medaljerstvo u klasi prof. Damira Mataušića. Uz nekoliko samostalnih izložbi, redovito izlaže na Memorijalnom trijenalu Ive Kerdića i na FIDEM-ovim izložbama. Uz tradicionalno oblikovane medalje posvećene osobama i institucijama, stvara kritički ciklus *Prevrtljivaca* i *Kolutljivaca*, „nasilno nasiljenih u geometrijske okvire“.

Born in Zagreb in 1986 and graduated in 2010 at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb, sculpture department – small scale sculpture and medal making major, class of Damir Mataušić. She has had several solo shows and regularly exhibitions at the Ivo Kerdić Memorial Triennial and at FIDEM shows. As well as traditionally formed medals dedicated to persons and institutions, she has created a critical series of *Chameleons* and *Rounders*, “violently forced into geometrical shapes”.

Stjepan Divković

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Rođen je u Pogoriocu 1961. Diplomirao je 1986. godine na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu u klasi profesora Stipe Sikirice. Brojni medaljerski radovi realizirani su u suradnji s Hrvatskom narodnom bankom i Hrvatskim novčarskim zavodom. Odlika njegovog likovnog izraza klasična je i tradicionalna, sa svim osobitostima pomno razrađenog sadržaja minuciozne izrade.

Born in Pogorioc in 1961 and graduated from the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb in 1986, class of Stipe Sikirica. Many of his medal-making works have been produced in collaboration with the Croatian National Bank and the Croatian Monetary Institute. His visual expression is classical and tradition, with all the features of meticulously worked out contents and highly detailed workmanship.

Rebecca Glavan Glušac

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Rođena je 1990. u Zagrebu. Diplomirala je 2015. na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu, Odjelu kiparstva – usmjerenje Mala plastika i medaljerstvo u klasi prof. Damira Mataušića. Sudjelovala je na desetak radionica i skupnih izložbi. Medalje *Sjećanje* i *Žalost* respektiraju klasičnu kružnu formu, no unutar njih oblikovano je posve osobno meditativno značenje.

Born in 1990 in Zagreb, graduated in 2015 in Zagreb at the Academy of Fine Arts, sculpture department, small-scale sculpture and medal making major, class of Damir Mataušić. She has taken part in some dozen workshops and collective shows. The medals *Memory* and *Grief* respect the classic circular form, but shaped in them is a completely personal meditative meaning.

Karlo Gross

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Roden je u Zagrebu 1978. Diplomirao je 2005. na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu na Odjelu kiparstva – usmjerenje Mala plastika i medaljerstvo u klasi prof. Damira Mataušića. Izlagao je na tri samostalne i redovito na specijaliziranim izložbama medaljerstva u Hrvatskoj i svijetu. Medalje pripadaju najnovijem ciklusu oslikanih medalja, na kojima potencira ekspresivnost robusnih arhaično – amblemskih formi i nadogradnja su njegovih ranijih ciklusa *Interijera i Aktova*.

Born in Zagreb in 1978 and graduated in 2005 at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb, sculpture department, small-scale sculpture and medal making major, class of Damir Mataušić. He has exhibited at three solo shows and regularly at specialised medal-making exhibitions at home and abroad. His medals are among the most recent cycle of painted medals which point up the expressiveness of robust archaic and emblematic forms and are developments of his earlier cycles *Interior* and *Nudes*.

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Rođen je 1984. u Zagrebu. Diplomirao je 2011. godine na Akademiji likovnih umjetnosti u Zagrebu, a specijalizirao 2015. na Odjelu kiparstva – usmjerenje Mala plastika i medaljerstvo u klasi prof. Damira Mataušića. Izlagao je na više od 15 skupnih izložbi u zemlji i inozemstvu. Kitovima, kao najvećim životinjama na planeti, autorov cilj je istražiti odnos veliki – mali, stavljajući ih u male skulpture i medalje. Medalja *Heritage* predstavlja drvo života hrvatskog medaljerstva.

The most prolific contemporary Croatian medallist, Damir Mataušić gives shape to commemoratives with a highly worked out personal system of symbols, in which he enriches the classic techniques of casting, striking and engraving with new materials, with incrustation and patination. A departure from the grander official works is the entirely intimately formed family medal or object.






